As we look ahead, it is essential to continue building on this success. Expanding the coverage of our hot air ballooning events remains a priority, and the CIA will continue to give its full support to PMR. We also look forward to aligning our communication efforts even more closely with the broader FAI media strategy, ensuring that ballooning has its well-deserved place within the global air sports community.

Another encouraging development is the growing international interest in our sport. Chile has recently joined our community, marking an exciting new chapter for ballooning in South America. Today, around 100 events already use our WatchMeFly-platform for competition management and scoring. With the new concepts under development, we see significant potential to increase the number of CIA-sanctioned events even further, providing more opportunities for pilots and nations to participate in our sport at every level. The future looks bright, and I look forward to shaping it together with all of you — because it is our community that truly makes ballooning so strong.

CIA Plenary Meeting 2026

February 4-7 2026 in AlUla, Saudi Arabia

The CIA Bureau is pleased to announce that the CIA Plenary Meeting 2026 will be hosted in AlUla, Saudi Arabia, instead of Riyadh as initially planned. The decision to change the venue was taken by the Bureau on 21 October 2025, following a presentation of the revised bid by the Saudi Ballooning Federation.

Due to institutional and partnership considerations, the host had to relocate the event to AlUla, a destination of outstanding natural beauty and cultural significance, which is also proposed to host the FAI Women's World Hot Air Balloon Championship 2027 and the FAI World Hot Air Balloon Championship 2028. The host is thrilled to invite all delegates, subcommittee and working group members, as well as observers. Rooms are limited but expected to accommodate approximately the same number of participants as in most previous CIA Plenary meetings.

The host will generously cover accommodation, local transportation from arrival in AlUla, and social events (see below for more details). We thank the host as well as all partners and sponsors to make this plenary in AlUla possible.

The Old Town of AlUla

Located approximately 15 minutes by car from Cloud 7 Residence AlUla and comprises of over 900 historic mudbrick buildings dating back to the 10th Century and reflect the lifestyle of its past inhabitants. Visitors can explore its history, local culture and experiences such as local markets, museums and restaurants and cafés.

Hegra

Saudi Arabia's first UNESCO World Heritage Site and includes the landmarks of the Nabataean civilization. Visitors will discover rock-carved tombs and intricate inscriptions at the entrances to the Diwan halls, each stop offers a unique experience to reflect on the architectural mastery and artistry of this ancient civilization.

Stargazing

Local astronomy experts guide visitors through endless night skies on an unforgettable afterdark desert stargazing tour, during which they will learn about constellations while hearing tales of how Bedouins have used the stars as navigation tools for centuries.

68th Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett 2025

The Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett was hosted in Metz, France this year. The 68th edition of the race began on Friday 5 September, with take-off from Metz, France. After three challenging nights in the air, Frieden and Witprächtiger landed on the banks of the Danube in Romania, having flown the furthest distance from the launch site. Their winning flight covered 1,359.09 km in 2 days, 19 hours and 30 minutes.

Behind the scences - by Nils Boelmann

Since 2017, the Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett has featured its own dedicated media production under the name Gordon Bennett TV. What began as a spontaneous phone recording has developed into a full-scale TV production and an integral part of the event. Each edition offers extensive live coverage of the world's oldest gas balloon race, combining livestreams, interviews and innovative camera perspectives. The aim is to share the fascination of gas ballooning with a wider audience and to present the sport in an engaging and accessible way. Beyond the competition, the broadcasts convey the atmosphere at the launch site, the teamwork behind the scenes and the challenges of long-distance flights, strengthening the community and raising awareness for this unique discipline in international aviation.

Marc André - Producer - (SUI)

As producer, Marc André coordinates all aspects of Gordon Bennett TV. From planning to execution, he ensures that the live coverage runs smoothly and that all elements come together into one coherent broadcast. His organizational skills are the backbone of the production.



Regan Tetlow - MC Airsport Presenter (UK)

Known across the airsports community, Regan Tetlow brings energy and expertise to the broadcast as presenter. With his live commentary and interviews, he creates the connection between the audience and the unique world of gas ballooning.



René Bühlmann - Technician (SUI)

René Bühlmann contributes behind the scenes with valuable production support. His role is essential to the technical setup and to ensuring that the coverage delivers reliable, high-quality results year after year.



Florian Michel - Editor (GER)

As director, Florian Michel manages the creative flow of the broadcast. From switching cameras to guiding the on-air moments, he ensures that the story of the race is told clearly and engagingly for viewers worldwide.



Christian Michel - Backend Support / YB-Tracking (GER)

Christian manages the race trackers, including preparation, distribution, and monitoring during flight. His work ensures that every balloon remains visible on the live tracking system. By maintaining reliable data flow, he provides the technical foundation for accurate and engaging race coverage.



Lars Stockmann-Olsen - Cameraman (GER)


As cameraman, Lars Stockmann-Olsen captures the key moments on site. In addition, he is responsible for editing content in cooperation with QuattroMedia, ensuring that highlights are efficiently prepared and distributed across media channels.



Nils Boelmann / (ehem. Ronald Kraffert) - Researcher (GER)
Responsible for background information and live data, Nils Boelmann
prepares the content that underpins the commentary. By supplying facts,
figures, and updates in real time, he helps the presenters keep the audience
informed throughout the race.

Gordon Bennett TV is produced by a small and passionate team of volunteers from Switzerland, the United Kingdom and Germany. Together they contribute expertise in presenting, producing, directing, camera work, research and technical operations, united by a shared enthusiasm for ballooning. Although the production takes place only once a year and is organised entirely on a voluntary basis, it has achieved a level of professionalism comparable to established sports broadcasts. Each member brings valuable experience from their professional background, combining their skills on site to create a seamless live production. Preparations begin with coordination and preinterviews in the weeks leading up to the event, but the real intensity starts once the race is underway. From that moment, the team works in full concentration to capture the beauty, drama and unpredictability of the competition as it unfolds in real time.

In cooperation with Quattro Media, Gordon Bennett TV ensures professional editing and worldwide distribution of selected content, extending the reach far beyond the ballooning community. What drives this achievement is not commercial interest but dedication and passion.



Media, Outreach & Technology

Over the years, Gordon Bennett TV has become a key element of the Coupe Aéronautique Gordon Bennett's international presence. What began as a small initiative has grown into a professional, multi-platform media production that connects pilots, crews and audiences worldwide. The broadcasts combine live transmissions, social media updates and editorial highlights, turning each race into a shared global experience. At the heart of the operation is a mobile production setup rebuilt from scratch for every edition. The workflow includes a studio for interviews and commentary, coverage of the Opening Ceremony, a full relocation to the launch field for the live transmission of the take-off and a swift return to the studio for continuous updates. Each transition demands precise coordination as equipment, crew and data connections must perform flawlessly under dynamic conditions. Professional lighting, graphics, live switching and drone footage together create the distinctive visual signature of Gordon Bennett TV. A major step forward has been the introduction of live connections from the balloon baskets, made possible through Starlink technology. This provides real-time insights from the pilots' perspective and allows the team to adapt the program while on air, capturing spontaneous and captivating moments as they happen.

The 2025 edition reached a global audience with more than 2,100 TV airings on 217 channels, over 61 hours of airtime and coverage on 35 international platforms including ZDF, ORF, ABC, MSN and Yahoo. The highlight show aired on FAST channels such as Rakuten and SportWorld, reaching more than 200 million households. Short clips on 26,000 public screens in Germany, Switzerland and Austria generated around 288 million contacts. Across digital platforms, Gordon Bennett TV recorded over one million views and nearly 30,000 interactions, while the live tracking website reached 68,000 unique visitors and more than 11,000 app downloads during the event. Today the participating teams actively provide high-quality footage, enriching the broadcast with authentic stories from the field. The show is carefully planned yet flexible enough to evolve in real time. During the latest edition, the production team established live contact with the Swiss team during their landing, integrating a basket feed on the spot while new videos arrived and were seamlessly added to the program.

Delivering this level of responsiveness and storytelling requires outstanding teamwork, technical precision and creative dedication. Together these elements have turned Gordon Bennett TV into a bridge between the pilots in the sky, the teams on the ground and audiences around the world. Through its coverage, Gordon Bennett TV continues to share the fascination, camaraderie and spirit of gas ballooning with the global aviation community.

Competing at the European Championship in Wieselburg, Austria, was truly an unforgettable experience. As the youngest participant in the field, I am proud to have finished 5th, securing a place in the top 10 among the very best pilots in Europe.

The region around Wieselburg was stunning, with its beautiful landscapes – and also quite challenging due to the tricky and unpredictable winds. These conditions made every flight both demanding and exciting, while also testing our ability to adapt quickly in the air. Another decisive factor throughout the competition was fuel management. Some of the flights lasted close to three hours, which required careful planning to make it through the tasks efficiently.

I want to congratulate all the pilots on their performances, and especially Stefan Zeberli on winning his 6th European title – an incredible achievement! A big thank you as well to the organizers for the excellent setup of the event, and in particular to Martin Wegner as event director and his team for their outstanding work. Their efforts made this championship run smoothly and at the highest standard. It was a privilege to be part of this championship, and I look forward to what's next.

Section 1 of the FAI Sporting Code states that "World Championships in the same sub-class, age or gender category shall not be held closer to each other than approximately two years" and "Continental Regional Championships in the same sub-class, age or gender category shall not be held more than once a year on the same continent".

The FAI World Air Games is the premier, international, multi-discipline air sports event conducted under FAI rules but is included in the table for completeness.

This event calendar does not show CIA Sporting Events. The objectives of Sporting Events include: encouraging participation in international events in which pilots of all abilities can take part and facilitating fair "entry level" competition using simplified rules that apply equally to all CIA Sporting Events and participants.

CIA Scholarships for Balloon Youth camps

For 2026, the FAI Ballooning Commission (CIA) will continue support of CIA Balloon Youth Camps (BYC). Balloon Youth Camps are an important part of the future of ballooning.

From past camps, an impressive number of pilots and P.U.T. have been camp attendees.

The CIA budget for BYC support is a total of CHF4000 with the funds to be distributed as follows:

- 1. Annual CIA Budget of CHF4000 to be shared across approved BYC applicants with a maximum payment of CHF1000 per country.
- 2. Each country is only eligible for one payment. Multiple camps held in any one country do not increase funds available for a particular country.

Inductees are elected into the CIA International Hall of Fame by the Selection Committee. Each year they will normally elect one living and one posthumous inductee from the list of nominated candidates.



Awards

Our sport depends a lot on the enthusiasm, work and devotion to our sport by many individuals and groups of persons. They spend a lot of time to spread and develop the sport through education, instruction, event organization or technical development. What can we do to recognize their work and to reward them? One way is to nominate them for an award.

Here are 2 great examples:

Montgolfier Diploma

The Montgolfier Diploma is awarded

for best performance in

- Gas Balloons
- Hot Air Balloons
- o Rozière Balloons

during the previous Montgolfier year or

for a major **contribution** to the development of ballooning in general.

Nomination forms need to be send by NAC's to FAI office latest 60 days before the CIA plenary meeting. This year the deadline for nominations is 8 December 2025.

Note: The Montgolfier year starts on November 21st and ends on November 20th the following year.



FAI Airsport Medal

The Montgolfier Diploma is awarded for outstanding services in air sport activities, training or education.

This medal was established by the FAI Council for the 100th anniversary of Lilienthal's first flights.

It may be awarded, at any time, to individuals or groups for outstanding services in connection with air sport activities like work in FAI commissions, organising World and Continental Championships, training and educating new pilots, or for promoting aviation in general, especially with regard to young people.

All FAI and CIA Awards

Below is a summary of CIA/FAI awards and a short description of the nomination procedure.

CIA SPORTING BADGES

Sporting Code, section 1, chapter 8.

The Sporting Badges are available in silver, gold and gold with one, two or three diamonds. Each require recognized performance in distance, duration, altitude and precision. Detailed requirements are found in the Sporting Code. Application form is available on the CIA web site, documents section. The application must be sent to FAI office.

THE MONTGOLFIER DIPLOMA

FAI By-Laws, chapter 7.2

Awarded for best performance during the previous Montgolfier year in gas, hot air or Rozière balloons and for a major contribution to the development of ballooning in general. Nominations by NAC's to FAI office latest 60 days before the CIA plenary meeting. Note: The Montgolfier year starts on November 21st and ends on November 20th the following year.

SANTOS-DUMONT GOLD AIRSHIP MEDAL

FAI By-Laws, chapter 7.2

Equivalent for airship pilots of the Montgolfier diploma awarded for best sporting performance during the previous Montgolfier year in airships or for a major contribution to the development of airship flying in general. Nominations by NAC's to FAI office latest 60 days before the CIA plenary meeting.

FAI AIR SPORT MEDAL

FAI Statutes 10.7

For outstanding services in air sport activities, training or education. Any number may be awarded to individuals or groups. Order forms are available at the FAI web site, documents page. Invoice for CHF 100 will be sent from FAI office.

The following are FAI General awards available for ballooning. Applications to FAI office before 31 May and shall cover performances until 31 December the preceding year or contributions over a longer period. Citations shall not exceed 250 words. Other supporting documents may be attached. The awards will be given at the FAI General Conference to recipients present.

FAI GOLD AIR MEDAL

FAI Statutes 10.2

One of the FAI's two highest awards. Given to those who have contributed greatly to the development of aeronautics by their activities, work or achievements. Since 1925, 76 Gold Medals have been awarded including 7 for ballooning and 1 for airship achievement.

FAI SILVER MEDAL

FAI Statutes 10.9

For persons having occupied high office in FAI or in a national organisation and have shown exceptional leadership and influence to the benefit of the whole air sport community.

DE LA VAULX MEDAL

FAI Statutes 10.5

This medal is given automatically to all holders of recognized absolute world records established during the previous year. Count Henry de la Vaulx was founder and past president of the FAI. He flew Gordon Bennett 1906.

SABIHA GÖKCEN MEDAL

FAI Statutes 10.8

The Medal is reserved for the woman who performs the most outstanding achievement in any air sport in the previous year. Sabiha Götzen was Turkey's first woman pilot and in 1937 became the world's first female military pilot.

OUTSTANDING AIRMANSHIP DIPLOMA

FAI Statutes 10.10

It shall be awarded to a person or a group of persons for a feat of outstanding airman-ship in sub-orbital flight during one of the previous two years which resulted in the saving of life of others or was carried out with that objective.

PAUL TISSANDIER DIPLOMA

FAI Statutes 10.11

May be awarded to those who have served the cause of aviation in general and sporting aviation in particular, up to three diplomas per FAI Member, depending on their class of membership, may be awarded. Paul Tissandier was a balloonist and Secretary General of FAI from 1919 to 1945.

FAI GROUP DIPLOMA OF HONOUR

FAI Statutes 10.13

A FAI Group Diploma of Honour may be awarded to a group (design offices, scientific bodies, aeronautical publications, etc.) that has contributed significantly to the progress of Aeronautics or Astronautics during the previous year or years.

H.R.H. PRINCE ALVARO de ORLEANS-BORBON GRANT

To Persons or institutions who have devoted themselves to create and/or promote technical developments and innovation in sport aviation. Additional consideration will be given to projects. Nominations should be received in writing by the FAI Head Office latest 30 June (using the Prince Alvaro de Orleans-Borbon Grant Nomination Form available on FAI website)

IOC Women and Sport trophies

Awarded annually to promote the advancement of women in sport. They recognize outstanding achievement and contributions made to develop encourage and strengthen the participation of women and girls at all levels in the sports world. There is annually one trophy worldwide and one each for the continents. Nomination forms will be posted to national Olympic committees.

FAI By-Laws 10.1

In 2024, the CIA approved a motion "to migrate all relevant documents to the FAI cloud by May 1st, 2024, and to work exclusively with this new document storage from that date onward."

To support this transition, we have purchased 50 Mountain Duck licenses, allowing easy synchronization with the FAI cloud—similar to how Dropbox works.

The purpose of using the FAI cloud is to ensure long-term preservation of all working documents and to guarantee that access remains intact in case of leadership or membership changes within your WG/SC.
